Annual Report of all projects from April-2014 to March-2015.

Life Line Trust has tremendously advanced in its service from 1998 to the downtrodden and neglected with its efficient and organized activities constantly in Salem District. The action packed prime activities of Life Line Trust in April-2014-March-2015 has shared its programs as the following;

1. Babies Home.

Introduction:

Life line Trust, Babies home, Salem is started in April -2002. The prime goal is to give maximum service to the babies received either by surrender or abandoned by the biological parent or relatives through In country adoption for their better rehabilitation and bright future. It is licensed for In –Country adoption by the Government of Tamilnadu.

Babies intake:

In the accounting year April- 2014 to March – 2015, 15 males and 34 females, totally 49 new babies were admitted in Life Line Trust Babies Home. We had 15 (13- female, Male- 02) received from Cradle babies reception centres. From that we had taken 2 female babies from Salem CBS,3 female baby from Dharmapuri, 1 male baby from Erode CBS, 2 female babies from Cuddalore CBS , 1 female baby from Pudukottai, 1 female baby and 1 male baby from Nagapattinam, 3 female babies from Tiruvannamalai and 1 female baby from Tanjur, 13 males and 21 female babies were directly received by Life Line Trust , Salem

Foster Care:

In the accounting year April - 2014 to March 2015, 4 males and 21 female babies were given under foster care to prospective adoptive parents. All felt happy and pleasure in bringing up their babies.

Transfer:

Ten babies had transferred to other organisation for better rehabilitation of children. (Appy – Tiruvannamalai, Pinky, Maheswari, Jamuna, Deepa, Hari, Jaganathan were transferred to reception home , Mahalakshmi was transferred to Arivagam, one bow leg baby (Aswathi) and one cleft lip baby(Jovitha) were transferred to Holy apostle's, Chennai

Death: Baby. Rashmi was expired due to HIV positive.

Reintegration:

Totally thirteen babies – nine male and four female babies were reintegrated with their biological parent.

Legalization:-

Legal, 34 cases of adopted babies got legalized. These cases had completed in District Court Salem. Registration of babies' adoption Deed were completed 24.

B. Child Labour Elimination Project – Thirumalaigiri.

Child Labour Elimination Project (CLEP) Thirumalaigiri, Salem is working to fight against the children working as bonded Child labour. CLEP works in Thirumalaigiri, Andipatti and Sivathapuram panchayats of Salem District in Tamilnadu.

Totally, we are rescued 203 children from June 2005 to March- 2015. Among these children, at present totally 52 (M-29 and F- 23) children are in our regular follow up. Children rescued this year 2014-2015) from child labour is Nil.

They are studying in formal and SMILE schools and vocational training centres. Educational support to 52 children and Medical support 6 children. Based on children's need and their Families' need, we were provided Family development supports. Dry food support for provided for 6 families.

Children Library at Thirumalaigiri: 32 children are in an average benefited per day in Children's Library at Thirumalaigiri in this year of April-2014 to March-2015. Children were read books in library and watched moral stories & cartoon movies in T.V. Children were engaged in in-door and out -door plays.

Tuition centre:-

More than 35 Children are coming regularly from 5 years to 14 years to improve them in their school studies and given awareness about child rights and child protection. Children are studying their school daily lessons and completing home works with the support of the teacher.

4. Reception home for Girl Children - Salem.

(Girl children need of care and protection)

Life Line Trust, Reception home (Girls), Salem is providing temporary shelter from April-2009 for girl children in need of care and protection for the children found abandoned, child labour begging or victims of exploitation or rescued victims of trafficking or rescued child labour .

Reception home for girls, Salem is working for the children in need of care and protection. We had given maximum care and total support to the children. Counseling sessions are also given for self esteem and moral support and also to guide for their future. Apart from daily routine, the children used to play in-door and out- door games. Based on the children's interest non formal education, tailoring, computer training, hand works and life skill education covered by the children to communication skills, decision making skills had been learnt by the staff. Regular medical checkups, outings are made for the children.

Reintegration: - There were 215 children reintegrated with the family.

5. MDM-THALEER CHILDREN HOME-IDAPPADI

A home for HIV/AIDS infected / neglected / orphan and abandoned children)

Introduction:

Thaleer children home was inaugurated on 12.12.2012 at No.75 B Tamilnadu Housing board Poolampatti road, Edapadi, Salem. Its main objective is to provide care and protection for HIV/AIDS infected, neglected, orphan and abandoned children in Edappadi and surrounding areas.

Children Admission:

At present we have admitted 17 children in Thaleer children home 10 boys and 7 girls. These children are belongs to very poor social economic background.

Children health news:

Monthly once all the children are going for general health check-up to local hospital and positive children are going to Salem government hospital for ART . We have nurse in Thaleer to take care of children health.

6. Sustainable Tribal Educational Program, Jawadhu hills, Jamunamathur.

We the Sustainable Tribal Educational Program working towards the children rescue in child labor, Child abuse and Trafficking. The Purpose of STEP is to support the child and provide adequate services of their basic needs of Education and giving them a secure life. The educational supports rendered to the vulnerable group of children.

- Present Total number of Children – 95 (Girls – 58, Boys – 37)
- Newly taken children in this academic year – 4 (boys-3, girls-1)
- 10th class this year – 6 children & 12th class this year – 6 children
- Number of children School changed for 6th , 9th & 11th class – 8 children
- Educational materials, notebook, uniform, school bag issued to children for this academic year on 13th of June 2015.
- Two days Summer camp conducted to children on 25th & 26th of May 2015

- Two children wrote 10th class exam – Sathya 418/500 and Priyanka – 377/500 marks.
- 12th class one boy Rajesh wrote and he got pass with 599/1200 marks.

7. Kirinji Children home for Girls, Jamunamarathur, Tiruvannmalai:-

In Jamunamarathur significant number of children struggling for their day to day life with and without parents and they denied to inherit their basic rights and working as a bonded labours, drop out from school in primary level and early marriage etc., So based on the field result our director has realized to provide holistic rehabilitation for such needed children i.e providing residential care and support. We will be given more rights and independent life to tribal children at the same time we don't want to change their culture, environment and their customs. Based on this, our director has created one more children home exclusively for tribal girl children at Jawadhu Hills. The home named as “**Kurinji**”

Presently 14 girls are in Kurinji home. They are studying in different schools. We have a project incharge, house mother and cook to take care of children.

Plan for 2015-2016

1. Care and protection of the children coming to Life line Trust.
2. Counseling and guidance to the children.
3. Reintegration of children in to their family based on the possibilities..
4. Better Rehabilitation.
5. Liaison with child welfare committee, Salem and Government departments for the speedy completion of legal procedure.
6. To provide individual care to the children.
7. Nutritional and balanced food given to the children.
8. To give proper medical care in time to the children.
9. Providing children friendly activities -yoga, handwork, painting work, beautician course, embroidery work, computer basic training and tailoring work to the children.
10. Files and Registers maintenance regularly and Proper documentation.
11. On line data entry for child tracking system.
12. Staff trainings.
13. Children trainings.

Conclusion:

Life Line trust provides good care for the suffering children in Salem and Tiruvannamalai. Children are very happy and they are good at school. We have to bring more support to the real needy children in these regions in coming future.
